General Information

Electrical hazards are one of the most common items identified on EH&S's shop safety surveys each year. Training staff to look for damaged equipment while performing daily tasks can reduce these hazards. Concerns should be reported to your supervisor so they can be repaired by authorized personnel.

Common Items

- Damaged cords
- Damaged conduit
- Damaged/burned outlets
- Missing cover plates

- Missing panel blanks
- Missing knockout plugs
- Exposed wires
- Lack of outdoor-rated covers
